FAQs - Graduation 2025

General FAQs

1. Where are the 2025 La Salle-URL Graduation Cremonies being held?

All the Graduation Ceremonies are held at the La Salle Bonanova Theater. There will be two accesses available: the main access to La Salle Bonanova, through <u>Pg. de la Bonanova, 8 (Barcelona)</u>, and also through <u>C/ de la Ribagorça</u>.

2. How long will the ceremonies last?

- 3. The Graduation Ceremonies have an approximate duration of between two and two and a half hours (2 h 2 h 30').
- · If you have not registered to participate, no problem.
- · If you are registered, it is important that you contact us at graduacio@salleurl.edu so that we can cancel your tickets and not wait for you at the event.

4. How do I know which ceremony and what day and time I have to attend?

On the <u>website</u> you will find information about all the ceremonies, with details of the day and time of each one of them.

5. In what language will the ceremony be held?

In the three official languages of La Salle-URL: Catalan, Spanish and English.

6. If I have not submitted my Undergraduate Thesis Project, can I attend my ceremony?

Yes, there is no problem. No diploma is awarded during the ceremony. The only requirement to be invited is to be enrolled in the Undergraduate Thesis Project (TFG) for the first time in the 24-2 academic year.

7. If I am not enrolled in the TFG, can I attend the event?

No, you can't. Only students enrolled in the TFG for the first time, during the 24-25 academic year, are invited to attend the event. If you are enrolled for the second or third time, you have already been invited in the past.

Tickets and access

8. How many companions can I bring to my ceremony?

You may invite a maximum of three companions.

9. Do children count as companions? And what about babies?

- · If the child needs a seat, yes, counts as a guest.
- · If the child does not have a seat and is with a family member, it is not necessary to get a ticket for him/her, since he/she does not count as a companion.

10. Where can I book the tickets for my ceremony?

On the <u>website</u> you will find a button with the link to the form where you can sign up and we will send you the tickets by mail.

11. Do I have to bring the tickets with me? Is the QR enough?

You don't need to print them, showing the QR code from your phone is enough.

12. Will there be streaming?

Yes, the Graduation Ceremonies can be followed via streaming. The link will be provided on the website to view the event, which you can share with whoever you want.

13. Can I choose the seats of my companions? What about my seat?

- The seating of the guests will be free. But you will receive an email from EVENTIX with the tickets to give to your guests. You may receive the tickets in your spam mail folder.
- · Students will be seated in alphabetical order. And you will receive the tickets by mail. Please note that the sender of the tickets will be EVENTIX. You may receive it in your spam mail folder.

14. Is there access for people with disabilities and strollers?

Yes, at the time of booking the tickets you must check the box for access for people with reduced mobility.

15. Is there a car park for cars and motorbikes?

Yes, there is a public car park on the La Salle-URL campus, but we cannot guarantee that it will have free spaces on the days of the events. Access to the car park is through C/Lluçanès, 43. There is also a public car park at Plaza de la Bonanova.

Other questions

16. What is the dress code?

The dress code for all the Graduation Ceremonies is formal.

17. Where can I see my graduation photos?

An official photographer will be attending the Graduation Ceremonies. The photos of all the events will be posted on the Flickr profile of La Salle-URL so you will be able to download them for free. There will also be a photocall at the end of the event outside the theater.

18. Where do I pick up my diploma after the ceremony?

Once you have finished your studies, you must get your diploma at the General Secretary's Office, which is located on the first floor of the Sant Jaume building of the campus.
